

The table below shows subjects that are taught in a blocked format. This means that lessons for each particular topic are taught on a daily basis over a period of one or two weeks. Consolidation weeks allow the children to revisit any necessary content from units taught so far.

Please select some from the following activities to complete throughout the term.

Name writing of full name—

Using the correct letter formation and only capital letters in the appropriate place.

*This can be done with pen and paper, using magnetic letters and then copying or painting it with magic paintbrushes (water) outside etc.*

Maths Games—

Play a game of dominoes and talk about the amounts and use the language more / less / equal too.

Play board games - counting on from different numbers.

Go on a shape hunt around the house.

Count out amounts up to 10 using different things and out of sequence.

History—

Talk to a grown up about the birthday parties they had as a child— what is the same and what is different?

Draw a picture of what you find out.

Draw around your hands and cut them out to create a pair of helping hands.

Practice reciting some nursery rhymes such as
