

The table below shows subjects that are taught in a blocked format. This means that lessons for each particular topic are taught on a daily basis over a period of one or two weeks. Consolidation weeks allow the children to revisit any necessary content from units taught so far.

Homework – The following optional homework tasks are in addition to the weekly spellings and reading that children are expected to carry out.

Autumn 1 –

- Research fun things to do in your local area – make an information leaflet about them.
- Keep a diary of the things you do at the weekend and try to include words to describe your emotions.
- Ask a grown up to write on some cards or post it notes with numbers less than 100. Turn them over and pick 6. Can you put them in order from the smallest to the largest? Can you order them all from largest to the smallest?
- Imagine you went to the deep depths of the ocean on a submarine. Write a story about your adventure. What did you see? What did you find?

Autumn 2 -

- Use a dice to create two 2-digit numbers. Can you add them together? Can you subtract them? Don't forget to draw the tens and ones.
- Find out about how Christmas is celebrated all over the world. Write some sentences about it.
- Create your own piece of art work in the style of Henri Rousseau. Remember that most of his art shows jungle scenes.
- Research the history of London. What did it used to look like many years ago? How has it changed? Draw some pictures and write some sentences to share with the class.
